THE HOBBY GARDENER September!

Oh dear, who would have thought our green and pleasant land would

look so parched and brown. My lawn, which is never



perfect, is brown dotted with green patches where the moles were busy last year, even the clover is looking sick.

My Japanese Anemones have not flowered yet, but the

Rudbeckias are looking magnificent, they have hairy leaves which helps with moisture retention. Most of

my shrubs and two small trees do not seem to be suffering, it must be the deep roots. Take note of what has survived or done well as the experts tell us



more hot summers could be the norm.



My cucumbers and tomatoes have thrived and if I keep up the watering and feeding, will continue for some time yet. I am sure the shading protected them and stopped them from scorching,

however I will clean it off soon as the plants in the winter will need the extra light.

The Dahlias have looked good, they have not suffered so much slug and snail damage because of the dry weather. I love the dark leaved varieties with single flowers like the Bishop of Llandaff and the Bishops children, the bees love them too, but they must be dead headed frequently to keep the flowers coming. I

do not lift them in the winter but put a layer of mulch or old compost over them to protect the tubers and let them take potluck, this also benefits the soil. I can always

raise some more from seed next year if needed.

Spring bulbs are in the shops now; it is time to plant crocus, daffodils, hyacinth, and aconites but tulips should be left until October. If the temperature has cooled and we have had some rain lawns can now be treated with an autumn feed and weed, but if they are too badly damaged you might have to reseed bare patches or if you want a bowling green returf the

whole lot. I don't mind a bit of clover and daisies, but I will try to reduce them.

The iris rhizomes need thinning out if I want better flowers for next year, so I had better go and get on with it. Happy gardening!

Interesting and Curious Facts of Upsteryear

He had both shoulders dislocated



He had both his shoulders dislocated. It sounds very painful, he would need to go to A & E immediately. Only this was in the 1800's and there was no A & E. Read on

and you will find out what happened.

So, this month we are going to look at what happened if you were ill years ago.

If you couldn't afford to see a doctor, and there was no NHS doctors then, you could always see the old lady in the village who would know many cures for common ailments and there wouldn't be a waiting list to see her. Some of these you might well have tried and some you haven't tried but have heard about.

One that is used a lot now is honey and lemon to soothe an annoying cough or sore throat, and one you may have heard of was the curing of a wart by rubbing it with raw meat, and then burying the meat in the garden. As the meat decayed, thewart went away. Then, there was Camphor with it's distinct smell that was used for coughs and colds.

But some of the medicines were revolting and the more revolting, the better they were thought to work. Here are just some of the most revolting (I do hope you are not having your lunch while reading this)

Mice which could be fried, baked or boiled would be given to patients suffering from whooping cough.

If you had a boil, or breast infection or cradle cap you needed to cover it with cow dung!

Mothers would benefit from baked hedgehog just after giving birth and the fat could be used by men to stop them going bald.

And if you think that was horrible, people suffering from chilblains were told to put their feet in a chamber pot full of you know what!

And then there were the remedies that would be illegal today.

There was the universal cure for every thing, opium, which came served up as – Godfrey's cordial, Dutch drops, laudanum and for babies there was Mrs Winlow's Soothing Syrup. It was much cheaper than a doctor and worked as pain relief and relaxant. Wisbech and the Fens used more of it than anywhere in the country.

But then for some suffers Mesmerism, or as we call it today, Hypnosis, was the answer.

Mr Tubbs who was at Parsons Drove and thenOutwell

in the 1800's performed many operations using this technique. So, in 1843, we have on record a man who had a molar tooth extracted with no pain and in 1853 a young lady had a breast removed with no pain.

This might have caught on but there were two things against it. Firstly, it is only possible to hypnotize 10% of the population fully enough to perform operations and secondly, by the late 1800's anesthetic was being widely used by surgeons and dentists.

If you broke a bone there were people who could set bones. It was a treatment that had been used for hundreds of years. Now bone setting is done by orthopaedics and often patients are given medicine to alleviate the pain.

In the Fens in the early 1800's John Mason moved from Coningsby to Wisbech wee he set up a surgery for anybody needing his services as a bone setter. He mostly worked from the surgery but he did do some house visits. It was after one of these visits to Newton that he was returning home on horseback late at night. Suddenly, a robber came up to him and pulled him of the horse. John got up, and getting to his senses, quickly grabbed the man and with his powerful strength that he needed for bone setting he grabbed the man's arms and dislocated not one but both his shoulder joints. The robber ran away screaming in agony.

Surprisingly, the following morning a man turned up at Mr Mason's surgery in great pain. He had <u>both</u> arms dislocated! John was very kind to him and put both shoulders back in place.

The robber went off rather sore but not aware that had

been cured by the same man who did it in the first place. Whether this story is true or slightly exaggerated, I wouldn't like to say but it makes a good story.



Google Search tips! By Philip Brooks from Diamond Byte

Millions of people use Google search every day. But many may not be using it to its full potential. Here are some tips and tricks to increase your Google search efficiency.

Use the tabs

The first tip is to use the tabs in Google search. Just underneath the search bar are tabs such as *All, Maps, Web, Images, News, Shopping and More.* By using these tabs, you can help define what kind of search you want as well as cut search time dramatically. If you need images, use the *Image* tab. If you are looking for a recent news article, use the *News* tab.

Search by date

Google will deliver search results that it thinks are most relevant, however they may date from some time ago and therefore be out of date. It's possible to search for results from just the current year or maybe from a specific period of time. For example, if you search for Windows 10, when you see the results, click 'Search Tools' at the top, then from the 'Any time' drop down menu, select 'Custom range. In the pop-up box enter a start and end date and Google will display only the results published within that timeframe.

Limit results to the UK

You may wish to search for places to visit in Washington. The most obvious results will suggest you take a tour of The White House or the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, USA. However, if you wish to look for places to take the kids in Washington, Tyne and Wear, click on Tools and select 'Country: the UK' from the Any country dropdown menu.

Use a hyphen to exclude words

If you find yourself searching for a word with an ambiguous meaning, for example Mustang, you may get results for both the car and the horse. If you want information only on the horse, type in Mustang -cars. Using a hyphen tells the search engine to search for mustangs but to remove any results that have the word "car" in it.

Check the weather

Again, simply type in Wisbech Weather or March Weather to see the temperature, rainfall and wind expected in the next seven days.



Advice for working at your desk

If your work is office or computer based you can spend a significant portion of your day seated at a desk which can lead to a host of problems for your health. But with a few changes and addition of good habits, you can keep productive at work and keep healthy.

Sit-well

It is really important when working at your desk that you are mindful of your posture and your equipment is correctly set-up. Things to look out for include;

CORRECT SITTING POSTURE



- Is your screen is at eye level? If your monitor does not have height adjustment, try elevating it with a riser, or even some old books!
- Keep your mouse close. It's easy for your mouse to drift away from

you when working, make sure you are not overstretching to reach it

- Keep your keyboard close. You should be able to sit up in your chair, have your elbows in an L-shape and still be able to reach your keyboard. If you are overstretching to reach it, you will need to make adjustments
- Adjust your chair. You should be able to sit right back into your chair, so your lower back is supported while still comfortably accessing your equipment
- Feet to the floor. The height of your chair should allow your feel to easily reach flat to the floor. Use some form of riser if needed
- Avoid crossing your legs. It can cause circulation problems and puts unnecessary strain through your lower back.

If you are unsure about your desk or workstation setup, ask your employers to provide a workstation assessment.

Regularly re-set your posture

While you may start off in the correct position it can be very easy to drift into a slouched position at your desk. Try putting a sticker on your monitor as a reminder to re-set your posture every time you see it. Take regular breaks

It is recommended that you should take a break from your desk every 30 minutes for at least one or two minutes. Try building in some of these good habits into your working day.

- Stand-up and move around for a few moments around your desk
- Use a break to get a drink of water, which also helps you keep hydrated.
- Rather than phoning an office colleague, can you walk over to talk to them?
- When taking a call, can you take the opportunity to stand-up rather than sit?

On the phone

If your work involves making lots of calls, avoid tucking handsets between your neck and shoulder.

Consider getting a headset so you are not battling with the handset, keeping your hands free and able to maintain a healthy posture.

Laptop working

Increasingly we are working directly off laptops, particularly if you are a mobile or remote worker or hot-desking across offices. However, the same rules apply and even more so if you don't have the luxury of an adjustable chair or monitor.

- If you are mainly working off a laptop you may want to consider getting wireless keyboards and/or risers so you can optimise your work posture.
- Also consider where you work your dining room table may be convenient but if of an incorrect height, extended working may cause shoulder, neck or back pain.

From John Peck's August 1832 Diary

John is now in his mid-forties. Not a month for harvesting as we have now, it's wet and prices not to John's liking. Cholera still in evidence. PCH

August 1. Met the Committee appointed July 2^{nd} . Rode over the lands; laid them into farms, and gave orders to have them advertised to let at Michaelmas. I proposed the term to be 5 years, and I think we shall average 25/- per acre, including the bare lands, which are to be sown with seeds.

August 2. A fine rain, just right for the new-sown coleseed.

August 3. To the teams at St. Edmund's, ploughing, harrowing and rooling the 15a. fallows. Some nice showers falling at times all day, much to the delight of all vegetation.

August 4. To Wisbech. Bought beef in the market at 6/6 per stone. A Mr. Childers canvassing for the County. His promises came forth in abundance; (if returned), should his performances equal them he will be a rare Member.

August 5. This morning, a heavy rain, and the day continued showery. Read Defoe's History of the Great Plague in London, 1665; The feelings of people were like the present.

August 6. <u>Started in gig at ½ past 4 for Ely; arrived there (by Welney), in 3 hours 40 min.</u> No particular business at the Assize, which were holden here instead of Wisbech, on account of the <u>Spring Assize being holden there, the cholera then being at Ely.</u> Dined at the White Hart and drove home, where I arrived a little past 9; the whole expenses 16/6.

August 7. Begun with 5 carts to get manure from the straw yard for 10a. Short Drove, 36 loads. Anxious to begin harvest.

August 8. Carting manure this day with 6 carts, 40 loads out. Began to reap wheat on 10a; not quite ripe, but much down, and the weeds growing through makes me think it better cut.

August 9. 6 carts finished the straw yard manure, making 116 loads. Many hands travelling about in want of work.

August 10. Another glorious day. Began to reap 10a. wheat Short Drove at 12/- per acre, and 6a. Johnson's Drove at 14/-. The corn is not yet ripe, but the hands are so numerous.

August 11. To the reapers in the morning, then to Wisbech market. Corn dull; coleseed at 24/- per coomb. Sir John Trollope at Wisbech canvassing the electors of the South Division of Lincolnshire, was received with applause.

August 13. A showery morning, and I was pleased to see it. Went to Wisbech Bullock Fair. Sold a poor rotten bullock for 45/-, and bought a pair of fresh beast for £25; many useful beast, and prices not out of the way. The day fine.

August 14. Reaping the 7a. wheat. Some gentlemen canvassing for Captain Yorke dined with me. How very anxious we seem about these elections, and how soon the thing dies away.

August 16. With the reapers, Tydd Fen and Harrold. A glorious day for the harvest; but the corn is not ripe - perhaps it will be better in quality, the quantity I hope will be enough.

August 17. Finished reaping 16a. & 9a. wheat Harrold and began 12a. P.D. Fen. In the evening a sale of Mr. Grimley's cropping, seized on to pay Pollard's rent. I bought 11 acre, a fine crop of oats, £68. (ADDED NOTE; More than a last of those oats knocked out by a hailstorm, Aug 26^{th} .) $12\frac{1}{2}$ acre wheat sold for £110; 19 acre oats was sold for £91"10s., and the remainder (small pieces), made about the same average.

August 18. A showery morning. Rode to the reapers and gave them money to spend in ale, to keep them from reaping corn wet. At Wisbech, samples of new wheat; the condition not good, and

merchants slow in buying., prices from 50/- to 60/- per qr. Such is the dreadful scarcity of money.

August 19. A rough windy day. Making arrangements for beginning to waggon tomorrow. There is an anxiety which I can't control - I feel as if I wished to be at it.

August 20. Began to waggon wheat from the 11a. Johnson's Drove. Reaping Weight's 12 & the 7a.P.D. Fen, also the 8a. Tydd Fen. The day fine, and all seems to go on well. This day I again rode my old grey horse, for the two-and-twentieth year; how much are we both altered.

August 21. Finished waggoning the 11a. and began the 6a. Johnson's Drove; reaping Weight's 12a. At noon it came on a gentle rain and stopped all. This day I have completed my 45th year; the Spring of youth is gone, Summer's ardent strength is fast passing away - even now I see the sear leaf of Autumn falling around me, which in a little while will close the scene in the Winter of life - the grave. Rain at night.

August 23. A fine day. Began to machine the 11a. wheat; not because I exactly want money, but thinking, from the state of the country, a large quantity must be thrashed out, which I am sure will very much reduce the price.

August 25. Finished reaping in Tydd Fen the wheat. Rain came on at 9 and stopped the waggoning. At Wisbech corn sadly down; much wheat selling under 50/- per qr., a sample or two at 56/-, very fine. Many new oats in the market, and best price 10d. per stone. These are prices we must submit to, and I fear still lower before Christmas.

August 26. Went to church in the morning; dined at home, tea at Mr. Ulyat's. In the afternoon a thunderstorm with hail and rain came over, and the evening cold and showery; I fear our hopes are clouded for another week. A thunderstorm passed over from NW to SE, and for a track about quarter of a mile broad the hail fell in such masses to break windows and thrash out many of the standing oats. On the 11a. I bought off Grimley at least a last is scattered on the ground.

August 27. A dull morning turned out a sorry day, heavy showers falling almost the whole of it. In the barn dressing wheat and grubbing the time over reading parts of many books, which in weather like this have no charm.

August 28. Finished dressing the wheat, and men to set up shocks. Some showers in the day, all the reapers idle. The newspaper again said corn was lower, a sorry prospect.

August 29. More rain fell in the night, and a lowering morning. Set the reapers to cut reed until noon, when they began to reap oats. 4 carts getting silt out the New Cut for yards. The mind is perplexed; I wish I had more fortitude.

August 30. Rode out with the Commissioners to fix the site of two tunnels to drain St. Edmund's Common. Heavy rain.

August 31. A finer day. Turning oats in Harrold, in the afternoon reaped some. Carting silt. In the evening put the new fire engine in the place built for that purpose.* Sky red.

(* THE FIRE ENGINE WAS EVENTUALLY HOUSED IN THE CAGE, BUT DURING PECK'S PERIOD AS CONSTABLE THE CAGE SEEMS TO HAVE SERVED ITS ORIGINAL PURPOSE AS A LOCK-UP.)

I Hate Exercise and I don't do mornings!!

So why do I find myself getting up early (well 9.0'clock) on a Saturday morning to attend Tai chi at the Sunset rooms for the past four years? Some of you may have even seen us practising in the park during lock down and ok on occasion we may have looked like demented flamingos, but we did not want to miss our sessions.

Quite simply because I absolutely love it and the benefits of it have far outweighed my expectations. "Well, that was relaxing wasn't it" but Tai chi is actually a fighting art developed and used by Chen Wang-t'ing a solider in the Imperial Ming army and by the 1800's it was the absolute pinnacle of combat and only taught to the Chen family, a closely guarded secret. However, a poor student who worked in the household of the Chen family, Yang Lu-ch'an, spied on the tai chi sessions and one day he offered to fight a stranger who challenged one of the Chen family. Yang fought so well that he was the only person outside of the Chen family who was ever accepted as a student, it was Yang who adapted

the Chen style to the classic Tai chi movements (the pandas) we know today omitting the more physically demanding and vigorous movements, and Tai chi became known and later practised mainly for its many health benefits.

So, what are the benefits? Tai chi is known to prevent degenerative illnesses, it mobilises the joints, stimulates and maintains the organs, improves the circulation and improves balance, posture and coordination. It improves the breathing and revitalises the body and the brain and promotes longevity. But Tai chi is also an holistic practice, it treats the body and mind as a whole and balances the mind and body promoting healing, focus, concentration and relaxation.

Still not convinced? as someone who could not put their socks on without falling over, who could not run a tap let alone a distance, and who suffered with depression all of their life, not only can I put my socks on whilst standing on one leg, I no longer take medication of any sort and ok I still cannot run but I am much fitter and have lost weight, an added bonus. always start at the beginning and repeat the exercises so complete beginners welcome. Our tutor Jason's enthusiasm and knowledge is first rate and he adapts the moves for all ages and abilities. You do not have to book just turn up, you will be made very welcome.

THE FENLAND FAMILY HISTORY SOCIETY INTERESTING FACTS.

As one of our speakers I attended the Gedney Hill WI to give a talk to the lovely welcoming ladies of the group. What a fascinating meeting place, the hall was named 'Fabric, Paper, Scissors'. Full of every craft you could think of, and surrounding it I was fascinated to see among other animals alpacas and baby goats etc. I thought about the name of the village Gedney Hill, where was the Hill? A little research gave me my answer. The word HILL is a corruption of the word HEEL, meaning a sharp bend in the main road like the turn of a heel. As I drove home I did indeed see the sharp 'heel' bend in the road.

Recently when visiting a supermarket I found shelves either empty or almost empty.

This reminded me of the rationing of food etc during and after the war caused by the then shortages. Some items were not put on rationing until after the war ended, including BREAD which was rationed from July 1946 until July 1948. JAM including Marmalade, Treacle and Syrup was rationed from March 1941 to December 1948. TEA rationed from July 1940 - October 1952, coffee was not available. SWEETS from July 1942 - February 1953. EGGS from June 1941 - March 1953. Dried Egg Powder was introduced. CREAM from November 1941 - April 1953. Other items rationed from January 1940 - September 1953 include SUGAR, BUTTER, CHEESE and MARGARINE & COOKING FATS. Even MILK was limited and dried milk introduced. MEAT including Bacon and Ham was rationed from 1940 - June 1954. Just imagine trying to arrange a wedding reception or family celebration when everything was rationed. In addition PETROL was rationed until the early 1950's as was CLOTHING including household items like sheets and towels which did not come off rationing until about 1953/4.

Brides were grateful to have sheets and towels as wedding presents.

In addition there were no fruits or vegetables imported from overseas, like oranges, lemons and bananas etc. Only home grown fruit and vegetables was available. I wonder how our population nowadays would manage if rationing returned. OUR COMPUTER RESEARCH SESSIONS are held twice a month. The first in Wisbech Library on the FIRST TUESDAY of each month from 10 - 12 noon. Our researchers are able to help visitors with their family research and show them all the wonderful research sources available in the library.

Our other session is on the SECOND MONDAY of each month from 11am - 2.30pm in the restaurant at Baytree Garden Centre in Hilgay near Downham Market. We offer help with family research to any visitors at the garden centre.

Our MONTHLY MEETINGS are held in Wisbech Library from 7pm - 9pm on the 4th Thursday. We restart our meetings on 22 September (the month has 5 Thursdays, so remember it is NOT the last Thursday of the month!). Our September meeting will start with our AGM (a short review of the year) and then we can enjoy the main part of the evening. Our speaker will be Kevin RODGERS with an interesting talk on music. Our October speaker will be Chris DONALD with the subject 'Unusual Historical Things - Wisbech & The Fens'. Everyone welcome to attend our meetings. Members Free, Visitors a £2

valuable source of meat for the family. Here is Joe Powell on his farm with his very good looking family of pigs.

House also had a fine family of pigs which he was very proud of. Usually by this time of the year, the pigs had grown enough to be ready for slaughtering. and so the services of somebody like Mr Stimpson who lived

in a small cottage near to Jack Sanders house would be called upon. Pigs did not have to be taken to an abattoir, but somebody with the skills of slaughtering and butchering was needed. Mr Stimpson provided such a service, Mrs Hilda Wilson, in her fascinating book called "Days to Remember" recounts the rather traumatic time that Mr



Stimpson's visits to the family home caused, and the sad loss of the family pig in the sty.

Then what to do with the meat from the pig. Nothing goes to waste from a pig, but of course without the convenience of freezers methods of preserving the meat had to be used. So salting and curing of the various joints for bacon and ham was the answer, and special talks with slideshows were provided to teach different methods of doing this in Gorefield Parish Rooms.
