## When Christmas had twelve days! by Diane Calton Smith

No sooner has Halloween passed, it seems, that the world starts turning towards Christmas. The long run up to the festive season, with all its anticipation, planning and commercialism, can sometimes absorb us as much as the festival itself. Christmas Day, when it finally comes, is over in a flash, and that, it seems, is that

Yet it hasn't always been like this. The whole twelve days of Christmas were honoured in full by our medieval ancestors. Each day had a different significance. Christmas Day (the first day of Christmas) was for feasting in celebration of Jesus' birth, but other days, such as the Feast of the Holy Innocents (the fourth day) were marked with sober reflection.

Christmas followed four weeks of fasting in Advent and it wasn't until late on Christmas Eve that people began to celebrate. They decorated their homes with holly, fir and ivy from the hedgerows and looked forward to sharing Christmas Day with family and friends. Even the poorest folk, who often relied on charity to get them through winter, saved up what morsels they could to make a modest feast and drowned their sorrows in ale. Christmas gave them a few days' respite from their labours and that, together with many traditional games, must have felt like a gift in itself.

At the other end of the scale, Henry VIII is remembered for his lavish enjoyment of Christmas. His court would light up with festivity, dancing, gift-giving and games. Much later, during the time of Oliver Cromwell's Commonwealth, the festive season was dealt a cruel blow. Celebration of this special time was severely discouraged and folk with little else to look forward to, in lives marked by poverty and gruellingly hard work, were denied this most traditional of comforts.

The Victorian era brought a whole new brand of Christmas entertainment. The cards, tree and bright decorations which we accept today as a normal part of our festivities were introduced at that time. Not everyone approved of this extravagance, however. In 1881, a contributor to the Cambridge Chronicle wrote to complain that, 'so many yield to noxious drinking and many move to noxious and expensive gluttony.' Though a different choice of vocabulary would be used these days, there are still people who might agree!

Sandra Gardner, who spoke to the children about why we observe Remembrance Day. She explained that this is a commonwealth-wide event that has taken place since the end of the First World

War to honour armed forces members who have served our country and defended our freedom.

figures/people of influence, we have been looking for a local person after whom to name our preschool class and discovered the work of Caroline Southwood Hill, the mother of Octavia Hill. In 1837, Caroline Hill and her husband, James, constructed Wisbech Infant School on part of the Wisbech Theatre site, which survives today as the foyer of the Angles Theatre, and in the school – which Caroline ran – children were taught 'the importance of truth, justice and mutual kindness and forbearance'. We feel that the work of Caroline Hill highlights the importance of the Early Years Foundation Stage as the foundation of education and therefore the perfect pairing with our preschool class.



## The Workhouse



But, not as Charles Dickens knew it

At Christmas time television often has the Christmas favourites. Films and plays

which have a connection with the winter season and of course, there's always James Bond. We see the films that have an Xmas feel as well as plays and adaptations of Christmas books. One of these books is "A Christmas Carol" written by Charles Dickens over 150 years ago but still popular now.

Another one of his novels is "Oliver Twist." It tells of the horrors of the Victorian Workhouse. Two films were made from the book as well as a musical, and even a pub at Guyhirn has it's name. If you were out of work in Victorian times most people ended up in the Workhouse.

Nowadays, if you're out of work you receive the Job Seekers Allowance.

But if you go back a few hundred years things were different. For the poor, all it needed was a bad harvest or a sudden illness and the whole family would end up in the workhouse. Sadly, families were split up. Men were housed in one section, ladies in another and children in another. Your clothes were taken from you and all inmates had to wear a uniform. It became a prison, beds were crammed close together and disease quickly spread through the building. There are countless tales of the severity and harshness of workhouses especially during the 1800's and Charles Dickens highlighted this in his book.

Inmates would rise, get dressed and washed by 6 o'clock. This would be followed by breakfast and prayers. Then, there would be work until lunch which consisted of bread and thin soup made with vegetables, bones and occasionally meat. More work and then supper which nearly always was bread and cheese, followed by more prayers and then bed.

The first workhouse to be built in Wisbech was in 1722 and was down in the Horse fair at Albion Place. It took up three acres and held up to 80 residents.

But,114 years later, in 1836 the Wisbech Poor Law was created and in the following two years the Wisbech Union Workhouse was built at a cost of (£468,000) £6,900 in a grand Tudor Gothic style. It was massive and included, two school rooms, a dining room, shoe makers and tailor's shops, two sick wards, two hospitals, ten sitting rooms, twenty three bedrooms or dormitories, four clothing stores and kitchens.

At the centre of this building was a big three storey

building with a bell tower. The rest of this impressive building was two stories high and the whole gave an impression of large grandeur.

The inmates were clothed and fed and it is said it was one of the best in the country. Far from Charles Dickens portraiture of a workhouse.

There was a census taken in 1881 and it showed that there were seven staff and two hundred and thirty eight residents. The children had separate accommodation and provision for elderly couples to be together was made. As well as this there were housed in the workhouse over eighty lunatics.

In the late 1800's the Vicar of Walsoken would spend his Christmas day carving a large joint for the inmates and telling them that he had visited many workhouses but none as good as Wisbech.


The workhouse inmates were treated to occasional entertainment and outings and the Mayor gave them special teas now and then.

Gradually, it changed it's use and became a hostel for the elderly and infirmed. And at this time there were tramps who would call in for a free meal. They could have a night's free lodging if they did one hours work in the morning.

There was a big piece of land down by the harbour railway line owned by the workhouse and inmates who were capable were sent to clean and feed the pigs that were kept there.

When the National Health Service started in 1948 the building became the Clarkson Geriatric Hospital and finally and again sadly, this building and all the history of it was demolished in 1982.

Wisbech has a connection with Charles Dickens. His original manuscript of "Great Expectations" is to be found in the Wisbech and Fenland Museum.

#### To keep healthy Get Active

#### **Get active**

We all know that getting active is good for both our bodies and our minds. It can improve your mood, give you more energy, and significantly reduces your chances of serious health conditions such as dementia and certain forms of cancer.

When you visit an osteopath, they can provide advice on keeping active so you can stay healthier for longer and fend-off those aches and pains. Not sure where to begin? Osteopaths provide advice on how much physical activity you should be aiming for, how to get started and about the positive influence that physical activity can have on your health.

#### Find an activity you enjoy

You don't need to spend hours in the gym if you don't want to, find something that you enjoy instead. You will then be able to fit it into your life and sustain doing it. Gardening, dancing or a walk in the park – every little helps. So how much is enough and what level of activity is appropriate? The guidelines differ slightly depending on your age, but everyone is advised to do some physical activity every day. This should include aerobic and strengthening exercises.

Adults aged 19 – 65 should aim for at least 150 minutes of moderate aerobic activity (e.g. cycling, brisk walking or pushing a lawn mower) every week, or 75 minutes of vigorous aerobic activity (e.g. running, a game of singles tennis or using a skipping rope). Additionally, strength exercises should be done on two or more days a week. These should work all the major muscles (arms, legs, back, abdomen and chest).

If you are over 65 you should also include balancing exercises twice a week (such as yoga, Tai Chi or dancing) as this will reduce your risk of falls.

#### What types of activity should I do?

A mixture of moderate and vigorous intensity aerobic exercises is also acceptable. As a rule of thumb, one minute of vigorous activity provides the same health benefits as two minutes of moderate activity. Moderate activity should leave you still able to continue a conversation without pausing for breath whereas with vigorous activity this will not be possible.

Different types of exercise and what they do

Aerobic/cardiovascular exercises: exercise that stimulates the heart and lungs to improve their function e.g. cycling, vigorous housework or mowing the lawn.

Strengthening/resistance training: this is where you are using the muscles against resistance such as lifting weights or using resistance bands or even activities that involve you resisting your own body's weight such as sit-ups or press-ups.

Stretching/flexibility exercises: these help to loosen stiff muscles, joints, scar tissue, and help you relax e.g. yoga or Pilates.

Balance: this can help with the control of movement and ensure that muscles are ready to support the body when needed e.g. dancing, Tai Chi or yoga. This is especially beneficial for those over the age of 65.

#### Tips for getting started

- It is important to build up slowly and allow your body time to get used to the new activity
- It is normal to feel a little sore or uncomfortable after exercise, but this does tend to lessen with time
- You are more likely to keep your new activity up if you start off with something that you enjoy, can do regularly or if you exercise with others Remember any exercise, even a little, is better than none. If you have been inspired to become more active but want more advice on how to get started or if an injury is stopping you, an osteopath may be able to help.

#### How can your osteopath help?

It is common to feel some minor discomfort after exercise as the body takes a little time to recover and adapt to the demands of your activities. Soreness often quickly resolves itself, but occasionally it may persist for more than a few days or make it difficult for you to continue your normal activities. In these instances you may want to seek advice from an osteopath. Osteopaths are highly trained healthcare professionals, regulated by law and recognised as one of the Allied Health Professions by NHS England. Osteopathic care is a safe and effective therapy that aims to promote the health of people through the use of manual therapy, exercise and health advice. It is suitable for all ages, from babies to the elderly.

December is a month when our gardens are not uppermost in our minds, Christmas is, a time to celebrate with our families and friends the birth of Jesus Christ. Traditionally there are plants we associate with



Christmas, holly, ivy, mistletoe, and Christmas trees the main ones.

Many ancient civilisations believed evergreens to have magical powers because their green shiny leaves remained on the trees when others lost theirs, so they brought them inside to pay homage to their gods, even the romans considered evergreens to be a symbol of good luck .It was during Queen Victorias reign that it became popular for families to gather evergreens to decorate their houses on Christmas eve and to take them out on twelfth night.

HOLLY-signifies eternal life, once used as a deterrent for witches, but Christians accepted the symbolism of it and now associate the thorns with the crown of thorns and the berries as the blood of Jesus.

In Scandinavia holly is known as the Christ thorn.

IVY-was considered a symbol of good luck and if it grew up your house walls it would protect the occupants from harm and evil spirits. During the great plague a vinegar made from the berries was supposed to help you and cups carved from holly wood were used to drink from. I I would not advise that today as many plants are poisonous.

MISTLETOE-Throughout the ages mistletoe has been given an aura of mystery, probably because it is a parasite growing on branches of other trees, often apple. It was important to druids and used to be hung over doors to bring peace and hospitality to the occupants and protection against lightning, poisons and evil spirits. During Victorian times it was shaped into balls and hung up for kissing games,1 berry was removed for each kiss until they had all gone and then it stopped, so I suggest you buy a big bunch!

CHRISTMAS TREES-one of the earliest references is to St Boniface in the eighth century who cut down a sacred oak to save a

young boys life and a young fir tree grew in its roots. Martin Luther illuminated a tree with candles to remind children of the light Jesus Christ brought into a dark world. In 1841 Prince Albert set up a lit tree in

Windsor castle and today it would not be Christmas without one. Happy Christmas to you all. I think I will put my feet up with a glass of Baileys and look at some seed catalogues.

#### FENLAND FAMILY HISTORY SOCIETY **INTERESTING FACTS**

One of my male ancestors was named Alma Alfred Hawkes, which I thought was a girl's name. I discovered in 1855 many boys were named Alma, after the River Alma in the Crimea and the first battle won in that war. I have recently found similarly named boys after famous events, including Verdun. Other children are named after places including Verona, Pretoria, Paris, India, Sienna and even Infield. I wonder the reasons behind those names. Our team find many strange names when recording gravestone inscriptions. Mount Pleasant cemetery has a long list of unusual first names, including Boaz Erra. Glendora, Hezikiah, Lepaukdro, Hegekiah, Temperence Britton Otley MILLER a great name to research. In Wisbech St Mary we found Annie Militant in 1884. In Whittlesey they found among many others Tryphena & Drusilla. In Chatteris Ethelreada, Fidela, and Zellah, Our Family History Society has recorded most of the gravestone inscriptions in the area and they are available to anyone interested. **OUR FENLAND FAMILY HISTORY SOCIETY** Our aims are to support and help our members interested in family history no matter where the family originated. In addition our team of researchers are willing to attend local events with a display linked to the theme of the event being held. If WiFi is available

we can offer family research to visitors. We record and transcribe records in the Fenland area, which covers three counties. We often get requests to look up a record, or to photograph a grave for distant members. Not all records are online, so we maybe able to provide the information members are looking
